

## Guidelines for Possession Order

### For Child between 18 months and 3 years of age

- (a) The provisions of this section shall govern the right of possession of a child between eighteen months and three years of age.
- (b) CERTAIN HOLIDAYS AND SPECIAL DAYS. This subsection shall govern the right to possession of the child for certain holidays and special days and supersede any periods of possession provided by Subsections (c) and (d) of the section. The possessory conservator shall have the rights of possession of the child as follows:
1. CHRISTMAS. The even numbered years of December 25<sup>th</sup> from noon until 6:00 p.m. and in odd-numbered years on December 26<sup>th</sup> from noon until 6:00 p.m.;
  2. THANKSGIVING. In odd-numbered years on Thanksgiving Day from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. and in even-numbered years on the day after Thanksgiving Day from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.;
  3. CHILD BIRTHDAY. On the child's birthday from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. ;
  4. MOTHER'S DAY. The child shall be with Mother from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. on Mother's Day; and
  5. FATHER'S DAY. The child shall be with Mother from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. on Father's Day.
- (c) Parents who reside 100 miles or less apart. If the possessory conservator resides 100 miles or less from the primary residence of the child, the possessory conservator shall have the right to possession of the child as follows:
1. Weekdays. On Wednesdays and Fridays from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. and
  2. Sundays. On Sundays from noon until 6:00 p.m.; or
  3. Alternative Times. For two periods of two hours each and one period of six hours during any seven-day period with no more than two days between periods of possession whenever possible.
- (d) Parents who reside more than 100 miles apart. Except as otherwise explicitly provided, if the possessory conservator resides more than 100 miles from the primary residence of the child, the possessory conservator shall have the right to possession of the child under the terms of Subsection (b) and for two periods of two hours each and one period of six hours during any seven-day period provided the possessory conservator gives the managing conservator seven days written or telephonic notice preceding any designated period of possession.
